Cambridge is one of Britain's most beautiful and historic cities

## The city of Cambridge

Cambridge has been one of the world's greatest university cities for 800 years. It is known throughout the world for its mediaeval university colleges, impressive architecture, the beautiful River Cam, and its green parks and gardens.

If you think of England, tradition and learning, you think of Cambridge.

But Cambridge is not only about tradition; it is modern, too. With a population of 100,000 residents and 20,000 university students, Cambridge is an exciting place in which to live and study. It is small enough to get around easily on foot or by bicycle, but big enough to have all the shops, restaurants, cinemas, theatres, clubs, museums, galleries and sporting facilities that you may need.

Of course, if you want to visit a really big city, London is just 45 minutes away by train.

## Student nationalities

Students come to Studio Cambridge from around 80 countries and speak dozens of languages. The mix of nationalities changes from year to year. However, it is typically:

# THE SCHOOLS

One of the longest-established English language schools in Britain, we have been part of Cambridge's education scene since 1954. We are well known and respected in the Cambridge community.

The size of a school is very important. We typically have 200 - 250 students taking the Intensive English courses at any one time. This is an ideal size because it allows us to provide:

- Classes at the appropriate level (often ten or more different levels).
- The opportunity to meet people from many different countries (typically more than 80 countries).
- A full range of social, cultural and sports activities (and at no extra charge).
- Our personal attention.

## We offer two locations:

1. During the academic year (September to June), classes are held at **Studio Main School**, Salisbury Villas, Station Road. We are just 10 minutes' walk from the centre of town and 400 metres from the main train station, with frequent services to London and other parts of the UK.

Our school, in impressive 19th century buildings, has:

- 22 classrooms
- Learning Centre (with library, computers, multimedia facilities)
- Free Internet access and e-mail
- WI-FI (Wireless Internet)
- Studio Café
- Garden
- Student Services Office, for activities
- Customer Services Office, for accommodation and welfare

2. During the summer (July and August), some classes are held at the renowned **Hills Road Sixth Form College**. This is one of the most respected schools in England. It is just 10 minutes' walk from our main school and has excellent, modern facilities, including:

- 20 classrooms
- Computer suites with free Internet access and e-mail
- Cafeteria
- Garden
- Student Services Office, for activities

## Student ages

The average age of students taking our Intensive English Courses is 22 years. The minimum age is 16 years. However, at certain times of the year we run our Sir George Language and Activity Programme for young learners aged 14 - 17 years old at our main school in Cambridge (see page 41).

During those times, if you are aged 19 years old or over, your classmates will not be younger than 16 years. If you are aged 16 - 18 years, some classmates may be 14 or 15 years of age.

# ACCOMMODATION

## Homestays - living with local people

Living with a host family in their private home - a homestay - is the best way to experience England at first hand.

All our hosts are known to us personally and we visit all of them at least once every year. They provide a relaxing and friendly environment, a clean and comfortable bedroom, good food, and a quiet place for study.

Homestays are normally located less than 30 minutes from school on foot, by bicycle or using the frequent bus services.

Our hosts are typical of British and Cambridge society as a whole: of different ages and occupations and from a variety of ethnic and cultural backgrounds.

If we place another student in your homestay, he or she will not be a native speaker of your language and your only means of communication, therefore, will be English.

## A choice of homestays

There are three types of homestay accommodation:

- Homestay Three Star  
Good, clean accommodation.
- Homestay Four Star  
As above, but of a particularly high standard, in a larger home or with additional facilities.
- Homestay Five Star  
Executive-standard, usually in a large house and typically providing a bathroom for your private use. This accommodation is most suitable for mature students.

## Your bedroom

You will have a single room, although double rooms are available for couples. Your clothes will be washed and your bed linen and towels will be changed once per week.

## Your meals

Your homestay hosts will provide breakfast and dinner from Monday to Friday and all meals at weekends. Lunch is available in school, at the Studio Café, from Monday to Friday.

## Lodging House or Bed & Breakfast

We sometimes can offer lodging houses (which normally have three or more students staying) and homestays which provide "bed and breakfast" only. Please contact us for more information.

## Residential accommodation

There are two Studio Cambridge student residences available year round:

1. Oak Tree House
2. Cherry Tree House

They are ideal for mature and independent-minded people who enjoy the freedom of not living with a host family and can cook their own meals. They accommodate up to 18 students, are well-furnished and have modern facilities including television and wi-fi Internet access. At least one warden lives in each residence and is available for help and advice.

## Oak Tree House

This residence, which we have had for several years, is situated in the Chesterton area of Cambridge. It has several single bedrooms, all with en-suite bathrooms. There is a shared living and kitchen area as well as a laundry room. You must cook your own meals, clean your room and living area and wash your own clothes. Bed linen is changed every week.

## Cherry Tree House

This residence is situated in the attractive Cherry Hinton area of Cambridge, just 10 minutes' walk from the school. It has single, double and twin-bedded rooms. Most rooms have private bathrooms. There is a shared living and kitchen area. You must cook your own meals, clean your room and living area and wash your own clothes. Bed linen is changed every week.

## CB1

Also new for 2013, CB1 is a large, new student residence, just 5 minutes' walk from the main school. This residence is available in July and August only. It has 90 single rooms, each with a private bathroom. There is a weekly maid service, but you must clean your room and wash your own clothes. Bed linen is changed every week. A warden lives in the residence and is available for help and advice.

## Your personal welfare

Your safety and well-being are very important.

- Our Customer Services Department has trained staff and a qualified Welfare Officer.
- You will be given a 24-hour emergency telephone number so that you can contact a senior member of our staff at any time.
- You will be covered, at no extra cost, by an insurance policy which will pay for up to £15,000 of medical costs, and for travel delays, loss of baggage and personal liability.

## Airport transfers

The cost of transportation from your airport of arrival to Cambridge is not included in our fees. However, Cambridge is very easily reached from all of London's airports and we will send you full information when you enrol. We can also send a taxi or private car to meet you, if you so wish.

## Activities

What you do after class is almost as important as what you do in class. Therefore, our course fees include the choice of at least five activities each week at no additional cost.

These are held during the afternoons and evenings and include sports, local visits, language games, arts and crafts and social events.



## Excursions (at additional cost)

London is only 45 minutes away by train and many of our students take the train in the evenings or weekends to visit the sights of this amazing city.

We also arrange weekend excursions to London and to many other famous cities throughout Britain. One-day trips include Stratford-upon-Avon, York, Bath, Canterbury, Windsor Castle, Warwick Castle, Salisbury and Stonehenge. Two-day trips are made to Scotland and Wales and sometimes to France and Belgium.

All of these excursions are available at an extra cost (approximately £20 for a one-day visit to London, for example).

## EFL 20



Content:	General English
Lessons:	20 lessons per week (15 hours)

Our EFL 20 course is in general English, with no specialisation. It consists of 20 lessons each week, typically from 09:15 to 12:45 each day, Monday to Friday. It is ideal for students who prefer to have their afternoons free.

The content of the course differs according to the level of each class. However, all courses include the study of grammar, speaking and pronunciation, writing skills, and listening and reading comprehension.

### Methodology

We adapt our teaching to the needs and learning styles of our students, following three guiding principles:

1. The teaching will be balanced with practice - you will learn and practise English, with an emphasis on speaking.
2. Lessons will be centred around you - you will not spend all your time listening to the teacher but will be busy using English in the classroom.
3. The language we teach will be recycled - we will not allow you to forget what you have learnt.

Each lesson is:

- Clearly focused
- Progressive
- Interactive
- Communicative
- Practical
- Dynamic

### Progress Tests

Each week you will be given a progress test to check your learning. As your English improves, you will move to a higher level.

### Self-study

In the Learning Centre, you will have access to a wide range of materials, books, CD-ROMs, web sites, CDs, cassettes and newspapers to use to improve your English. The Learning Centre has active WI-FI - useful if you are bringing your own laptop.

### Tutorials

You will have the opportunity for private meetings with your teacher - tutorials - to work on your individual needs and to discuss your progress.

### Modern technology

Lessons regularly incorporate modern media, including listening exercises based on Internet sources, video clips and the latest news. All our classrooms have active WI-FI and most are fitted with data projectors and speakers. The technology is used alongside more traditional classroom teaching techniques, such as choral repetition and grammatical time-lines.

## EFL 28

EFL 28 is our most popular course. It consists of 28 lessons (21 hours) each week. If you take this course you will:

- study on the EFL 20 course (pages 9 & 10) during the mornings, from 09:15 to 12:45 (20 lessons / 15 hours per week); and
- study from 13:45 to 15:15 every afternoon except Friday (8 lessons / 6 hours per week), choosing from six specialised options.

### The specialised options

The options available to you depend on your level of English and the length of time you will be studying with us.

You can combine options. You can also transfer to one of our examination courses (see pages 15 - 16).

### Ensuring your success

The EFL 28 Course, like our Examination courses, is the most effective way to improve your English in the shortest possible time. It is:

#### 1. Intensive

The 28 lessons each week of in-class teaching, additional optional study in the Learning Centre, plus homework are just the start. In addition to that, you will spend every minute of your waking life speaking or listening to English. Who knows, after a few weeks you might be dreaming in English!

#### 2. Demanding

Your classmates – a maximum of 16 in each class – will be at your level. Through the daily interaction of the classroom, plus weekly progress tests and frequent private meetings (tutorials) with your main teacher, you will be challenged to go at your fastest possible pace - to do your personal best.

#### 3. Specialised

By choosing your own afternoon option, or variety of options, we can design the ideal course for you as an individual.

#### Examples

- Option 2 - if you want to learn more about British history.
- Option 3 - if you need English for a career in business.
- Option 5 - if you want to prepare for the IELTS examination.

### Study longer for less

The EFL 20 and EFL 28 courses cost less per week the longer you study. This is important for students coming for a whole academic year.

**EFL 28 Option 1 - Language Skills Plus**

This option builds on your morning lessons. Each lesson focuses on one of the four main language skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing. Exciting, practical materials and techniques are used, such as radio interviews, magazine articles, songs and films clips, followed by a discussion of their content. There is additional emphasis on vocabulary and pronunciation.

**EFL 28 Option 2 - Cultural Studies**

Study English while learning about your host country, Britain. Find out about cultures from around the world from experts - your classmates! Topics include:

- English literature
- British history
- Film studies
- British traditions and festivals
- Accents and pronunciation
- International studies

**EFL 28 Option 3 - English for Business**

This option develops your fluency in English in the specific environment of international business. It will give you the essential language and presentational skills and confidence, both oral and in writing, in areas such as:

- Sales negotiation
- Money and banking
- International trade
- Management
- Business letters and reports
- Chairing and participating in meetings
- Minutes and agendas
- Interpreting graphs and describing trends

Studio Cambridge is an official test centre for TOEIC (the Test of English for International Communication). TOEIC is one of the examinations offered by the Education Testing Service (ETS) in the United States. This examination is highly valued in the business world as its questions simulate real-life situations which are relevant to the global workplace. We can arrange for you to take the TOEIC.

Please note that this course may be combined with Option 6.

### EFL 28 Option 4 - Reading and Writing

This option is especially useful if your native language does not use the Roman alphabet or if you need particular help in developing your reading and writing skills. It is a very popular option for students intending to take an internationally recognised examination, such as IELTS, and will help students raise their reading and writing scores from the 3.0 - 4.0 bands.

### EFL 28 Option 5 - Academic English

This option focuses on the specialised language required in the academic world. It is also useful preparation for examinations such as IELTS and the University of Cambridge examinations (see pages 15 and 16). Whether or not you intend to take an examination, this is an excellent choice if you need to develop your knowledge of formal written English.

Topics include:

- The formal lexis and structures used in academic writing
- Describing graphs, charts and diagrams
- Taking notes from lectures
- Planning, organising and writing essays
- Understanding scientific texts
- Reading and writing under time constraints
- Prioritising
- Study skills

### EFL 28 Option 6 - TOEIC preparation

This course prepares you for the Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC). TOEIC is used throughout the world as an assessment of English Language Proficiency. It provides potential employers with a guide to candidates' skills in using English for communication with international partners or clients.

Studio Cambridge is an official Test Centre for TOEIC, and the exam is held at the school, at the end of each course. This course may be amalgamated with Option 3.

University of Cambridge Examination course (CAM 28)



This course is designed for students wishing to take the University of Cambridge FCE and CAE examinations, and also for people who want a highly structured and demanding course with a greater emphasis on grammar and writing.

Our longer courses (9 – 13 weeks) will improve your level of general English and teach the techniques necessary to achieve success in the examinations.

Our shorter courses (of 6 or 7 weeks) focus primarily on examination technique and are only suitable if you already have the appropriate level of English. If you are in doubt about your level of English, or which course to take, please contact us.

Specialised books

This course requires the use of specialised textbooks. The cost of these books is estimated at £40 per course and should be paid in the school.

### IELTS Examination course (IELTS 28)

The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) examination is an internationally-recognised qualification for entry to universities and colleges throughout the English-speaking world. Our IELTS Examination course is ideal preparation and has proven to be highly effective. All 168 lessons (6 weeks at 28 lessons per week) concentrate exclusively on the examination.

The course is designed to ensure that you achieve at least the minimum score for entry to a degree course at a British university, usually 6.0. You will need to be at least at the Upper Intermediate level (IELTS 5.0) to start this course. However, it is also suitable for students aiming for 7.0 or higher.

If your level of English is well below your target score, you should start your studies on the EFL 28 course (see page 14) with Option Five (Academic English) and transfer to the IELTS examination course towards the end of your studies.

**Examination Courses – special features**

The CAM 28 and IELTS 28 courses are highly specialised. They concentrate on the skills and techniques needed to achieve success in these examinations:

- Use of English (grammar and vocabulary)
- Writing skills (essays, proposals, reports, reviews)

- Listening skills (radio and TV news programmes, speeches, interviews)

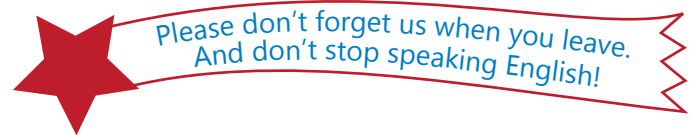

## THE TOWN

# Terms and Conditions

These **Terms and Conditions** apply both to the student and to his or her parent or guardian if the student is under the age of 18 years (the person who signs the Application Form). The words "you" and "your", therefore, apply to both the student and his or her parent or legal guardian. The text in black refers to all students. Text in blue refers to students applying for, or taking, our Intensive English Courses. Text in green refers to students applying for, or taking, our Language and Activity Programmes.

## Your application

1. This brochure and the Course Fees and Application leaflet supersede all previous versions.
2. It is our policy to deal with all matters relating to your enrolment in a fair and open manner.
3. We undertake to offer our courses and services as described in this brochure. We are, however, reliant on the accuracy of applications for enrolment when assigning students to courses and accommodation (by age or nationality, for example).
4. We do not accept responsibility for the provision of any services that are not expressly mentioned in the brochure.
5. All courses are offered subject to demand.
6. Where insufficient bookings lead us to cancel any course mentioned in the brochure, we will make every effort to offer you an alternative course.
7. If we are unable to accept your application for enrolment, we will offer you an alternative course or course start date or will suggest a similar course at a comparable school. If these are not acceptable to you, we will refund all monies paid.
8. We reserve the right not to accept any application. In the event that your application is declined, all monies received will be refunded in full.
9. Once your application has been received, and the enrolment confirmed, a binding contract exists between you and Studio Cambridge.
10. Once a contract exists, all fees are due for the full period of your course.
11. Payments may not be made in instalments.
12. The person signing the application takes responsibility for paying all required fees.
13. Fees must be received by Studio Cambridge no less than four weeks before the start of your course. Failure to comply with our payment terms may result in your enrolment being cancelled.
14. In compliance with British government regulations, the School will not accept cash payments in excess of €15,000 or their equivalent.
15. We reserve the right not to admit you to a course where the appropriate payment has not been received.
16. You must pay any bank charges incurred in making the payment to the school. Any change which results in additional charges must be paid for before the change is implemented.

## Applicants with disabilities

17. Studio Cambridge's main school is located in 100 year old buildings on five floors and without lifts. We have limited facilities for the disabled, therefore, but do our best to make reasonable adjustments in order to accommodate the needs of such students.

We also run courses at many other schools and colleges; students are accommodated in student residences or with host families, and social, cultural and sport activities are often included as part of our educational programmes. The suitability and accessibility for disabled students of the schools, the courses and the accommodation are different in each case.

If you have any physical, mental or learning impairment or special educational need please inform us prior to enrolment. We will be pleased to advise on the suitability of each of our schools, educational programmes, activities and accommodation to you as an individual.

## Visas

18. If you come from a country whose nationals are required to be in possession of a visa to enter the United Kingdom, it is your responsibility to obtain that visa.
19. On receipt of your application, plus the deposit or full fees, we will confirm receipt of the application and a place on the course will be kept open for you.
20. The booking itself will not be confirmed until you inform the School that you are in possession of a visa.
21. On request, we will give you a letter confirming that your application has been received or a "CAS" (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies). These can be used to support your application for a visa.
22. If your application for a visa is unsuccessful, we will refund all monies paid on receipt of a copy of the letter of refusal from the British authorities (British Consulate or Visa Section of a British Embassy). If an appeal process is available to you, we will only make the refund when the appeal has been unsuccessful.

## Your course

23. All students are expected to complete the course in which they have enrolled and to attend all classes. If you fail to do so we may advise the British authorities (the Home Office) of your noncompliance with these conditions.
24. If you are dissatisfied with a course, or any aspect of the services offered by Studio Cambridge, you must bring that dissatisfaction to the attention of the Principal or Course Director as soon as possible in order that a solution may be found without delay.
25. Once a complaint has been brought to our attention we will make every effort to resolve the problem within 24 hours.
26. If you are still not happy with the situation you may ask for the matter to be referred to the Operations Director, who will give a decision within 24 hours.
27. We will not accept a complaint after the end of the course, if it has not been brought to our attention as explained above.
28. We expect all our students to be well motivated, polite and considerate towards others, especially their Homestay hosts, and to observe such rules as are at the time in force.
29. We reserve the right to ask any student who does not comply with the above to leave the course. In this case, no refund of fees will be made, and any extra costs involved will be the responsibility of the student or his or her parents or sponsor.
30. We reserve the right to ask any student whose course attendance is unsatisfactory to leave the programme. In this case, no refund of fees will be made.
31. In the event that a student is required to leave a course, we will inform the appropriate

authorities (such as the British Home Office).

32. By enrolling you on a Studio Cambridge course, your parents/guardians are granting you permission to attend any activities organised by the school.
33. If your English is at the Beginner level and in the unlikely event that there are no other students at your level, we reserve the right to offer you private lessons in lieu of group lessons until you have reached the appropriate level. There will be no additional charge, but the number of private lessons will be provided at a ratio of 1 private lesson = 3 group lessons.
34. We do not accept liability for the loss of, or damage to, any person's property while on the School's premises. We do not accept any liability for loss or damage in which our students are involved.
35. We will hold you liable for any wilful damage you may cause and you will be asked to pay for the cost of repair or replacement.
36. With a minimum of one weeks' notice and the agreement of the Director of Studies or Principal, students who have been studying for 12 weeks or longer may take a one week holiday, for every 12 weeks of their studies. Such holidays may only be taken if they begin and end on weekends. Subject to your hosts' agreement, you may return to, and leave your belongings at, your homestay during this time. In this case, a fee may be charged.
37. We shall not be liable to you in the event that any service contracted to be supplied becomes impossible to supply because of any circumstances, such as industrial dispute, which are outside our control.

## For students taking an Intensive English Course

### Cancellation of your application

38. If we receive cancellation of your course, in writing, more than four weeks before the course starts, you will be responsible for paying just the Registration Fee (£70.00).
39. If you cancel a course, in writing, and we receive this notification less than four weeks before the course starts, you will be responsible for paying the Registration Fee and Deposit (a total of £300.00).
40. If we do not receive your cancellation in writing, or do so after the course in which you are enrolled has started, your cancellation will be treated as "termination" of the course. The conditions pertaining to termination are given below.
41. If you apply for a visa and your application is unsuccessful, we will refund all monies paid as described in these Conditions

### Termination of your course or accommodation

42. If you wish to withdraw from your course (the lessons) once it has started, you must give four weeks' written notice or make payment of Tuition fees in lieu of notice. A refund will then be made of 50% of the Tuition fees for the unused portion of the course in excess of the four weeks' notice period.
43. If you wish to withdraw from your accommodation it will be kept available, and must be paid, until the Saturday of the week after you give us notice. A refund will then be made of 100% of the Accommodation fees remaining from that Saturday onward.
44. Please note: the insurance policy (included in the fees) covers you for cancellation or withdrawal from a course due to illness or other compelling reasons. If you are eligible for a refund under the provisions of this insurance, no further refund will be made by the School. Details of the insurance are available from Studio Cambridge.

## For students taking a Language and Activity Programme

### Cancellation of your application

45. If we receive cancellation of your course, in writing, more than four weeks before the course starts, you will be responsible for paying just the deposit (£300.00).
46. If you cancel your course less than four weeks before the course starts, or if you fail to cancel, you will be responsible for paying the full fees for your course.
47. If you apply for a visa and your application is unsuccessful, we will refund all monies paid as described in these Conditions

### Termination of your course

48. No refunds will be made for early withdrawal from a course.  
Please note: the insurance policy (included in the fees) covers you for cancellation or withdrawal from a course due to illness or other compelling reasons. If you are eligible for a refund under this insurance, no further refund will be made by the School. Details of the insurance are available from Studio Cambridge

### Refunds

49. Refunds will be made only to the person (such as a parent) or organisation (such as a Studio Cambridge agent) from whom we received the fees. Refunds can only be made to you if you originally paid the fees directly to Studio Cambridge yourself. All refunds will be made to the original payer's bank account or credit card and will not be made in cash.
50. Refunds will not be given for any part of the programme (such as an excursion) missed because of your arrival, departure or other travel arrangements.
51. All refunds will be made in £ Sterling only.
52. Any bank or other charges payable will be deducted from the money refunded to you.
53. Any refunds made will be based on the published fees for the length of the course taken.

## Your agreement to these terms and conditions

54. By signing the application form, you or your parents/guardians, authorise Studio Cambridge to take appropriate action in the case of a medical emergency and acknowledge that the person signing the application form is responsible for paying all costs incurred.
